



Welt the chocolate, golden syrup and butter in a bowl set over a saucepan of genity simmering water (do not let the base of the bowl touch the water). Stir the mixture until smooth. Remove the bowl from the heat and genity stir in the cornflakes until all of the cereal is coated in the chocolate. Divide the mixture between the paper cases and press 3 chocolate eggs into the centre of each nest. Chill in the fridge for 1 hour, or until completely set. |




Maths:
