Message from Staff and Governors:

Helping to keep all of our children safe in school

How would you feel if your parking contributed towards a child being injured? We have had some near misses and it's a great concern of ours.

We have received concerned emails from parents about the parking near the school. We pay for parents to park in the village hall and built a path to the school for families to use, keeping all our children safe.

We are mindful we have children as young as four being dropped off each day, sometimes with younger siblings, often needing to cross the road. We have Travis Perkins lorries, bin lorries, large farm vehicles and school coaches passing the school. This can become very dangerous when cars block the road, narrowing it, and so restricting the visibility of oncoming traffic.

We again ask parents to adhere to the following when parking, dropping off or collecting children from school at peak times:

- Do not park within 10 metres of the school junction as per the Highway Code • Rules
- Keep the zig zag lines clear outside of the school entrance •
- We encourage a one-way system, driving from Travis Perkins along Mill Lane, in a voluntary one-way system, during drop off and pick up times
- Ensure pavements and pedestrian access points are kept clear
- Ensure emergency vehicles can pass if needed

We will continue to teach children about road safety and the need to be careful outside the school when crossing the road. Parents who drive to school must be mindful not only of their children's safety, but also the safety of the other children in our school. Thank you for your understanding.
