## Egg Drop Challenge

The Annual Egg Drop Challenge is back on Thursday 30<sup>th</sup> March!

### Reminder of the rules:

- No parachutes or balloons!
- At least ¼ of the egg should be always showing so the children must not completely cover the egg with any material.
- It should be possible to clearly see a part of the egg as it is housed in the design.
- The design must not include changing the egg in any way (no tape or nail polish on the egg!).
- The container must be able to be opened once dropped so that the condition of the egg can be checked!
- The inside materials must be designed to allow a raw egg to be easily inserted and removed.
- The eggs will all be dropped from height outside or in the school hall (weather permitting)!



On Tuesday this week, year's 1 and 2 were given the option to wear Scottish attire, farming clothes or garments to the style of characters from the Katie Morag stories. We enjoyed welcoming in parents/ grandparents to school who were able to work with the children on their story writing and see what the current literacy expectations are.
