IMPORTANT SAFEGUARDING NOTICE CONCERNING THE SPY DOGS/SPY PUPS/SPY CATS BOOKS by Andrew Cope

Do your children have any of the popular Spy Dogs/Spy Pups/Spy Cats books at home?

There has been an announcement in the press which has been brought to our attention that some editions of these books include a printed web address at the back. This link used to go to the author's website, but the domain is no longer under his control. It has since been taken over by a third party and now leads to inappropriate adult content.

The publisher, Puffin, has halted distribution and sales of the books and is working with retailers to remove copies from circulation. They have emphasised that the website has no connection to the author or publisher.

If your child has any Spy Dog, Spy Cat or Spy Pups books at home, please check the back for website links and make sure they do not try to visit the site.

It is, however, safe for children to continue reading the stories themselves — the concern is only with the outdated link.
