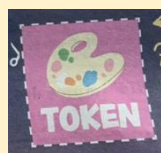


Please note this is not a general "dress down" day – the children need to be wearing spots or yellow to support Pudsey!

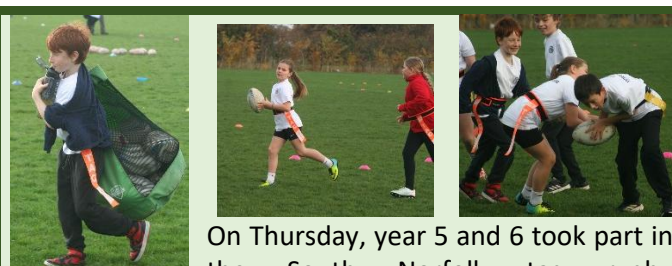
Things we are collecting this half term:

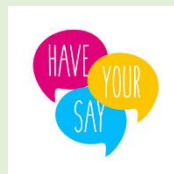
Some reminders:

We are coming into that time of year where we see increased use of inhalers. If your child needs an inhaler in school these need to be handed to the office for KS1 children and to the class teacher for KS2. **In addition an Asthma Care plan must be completed for any child with an inhaler in school.** Inhalers must not be kept in school bags "just in case" of need – the school has to record any time an inhaler is used and we obviously cannot monitor this if the children are using their inhalers without staff knowledge.
